**ORDINANCE NO. 18-O-4**

**AN ORDINANCE TO REPEAL CHAPTER 2, ARTICLE XI, DIVISION 1,**

**SECTION 2.53.4 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF ANNISTON, ALABAMA, 1981 REGULATING  
BOARDS, COMMISSIONS AND AUTHORITIES**

WHEREAS, the Council for the City of Anniston, Alabama finds that the City's ordinance governing the Council's confirmation of nominees for appointment to positions on the City's boards, commissions and authorities is due to be amended to eliminate the requirement that nominees appear before the Council for a confirmation hearing before the nominee is eligible for appointment;

WHEREAS, the Council finds that the amendments set forth herein are in the best interests of the City of Anniston, its boards, commissions and authorities, and its citizens.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Anniston, Alabama as follows:

Section 1. Chapter 2, Article XI, Division 1, Section 2.53.4 of "The Code of The City of Anniston, Alabama, 1981", enacted by Ordinance No. 14-O-13, as amended, is hereby repealed in its entirety.

Section 2. Chapter 2, Article XI, Division 1, Section 2.53.4 of "The Code of The City of Anniston, Alabama, 1981" shall be designated, "Reserved."

Section 3. This Ordinance shall become immediately effective after its adoption and its publication one (1) time in The Anniston Star, a newspaper of general circulation published in the City of Anniston, Alabama. The City Clerk is hereby ordered and directed to cause a copy of this Ordinance to be published one time in said newspaper.

#### **ORDINANCE NO. 18-O-5**

#### **AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE TRAFFIC SCHEDULE TO ADD AND REMOVE**

#### **TRAFFIC LIGHTS AND STOP SIGNS**

WHEREAS, the Council finds that the traffic signal on 15th Street at its intersection with Cooper Avenue is due to be removed and replaced with a two-way stop sign;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council for the City of Anniston, Alabama as follows:

Section 1. The City Council of the City of Anniston, Alabama hereby amends and restates Section 15.54(a), of "The Code of the City of Anniston, Alabama, 1981" in its entirety to read as follows:

#### **Sec. 15.54 – Traffic lights, ect., generally.**

No person, while operating a vehicle or as a pedestrian, shall disregard or disobey immediately controlling his movements, given or indicated by a street traffic signal light or sign located at any of the following street intersections within the city:

(a) All roadways beginning with the letter "A" through "D":

- (1) Brown Avenue and 15th Street.
- (2) Clydesdale Avenue and 10th Street (Old 202).
- (3) Clydesdale Avenue and 10th Street (Eulaton Road).
- (4) Cobb Avenue and 14th Street.
- (5) Cobb Avenue and 15th Street.

Section 2. The City Council of the City of Anniston, Alabama hereby amends and restates Section 15.58, Section C of "The Code of the City of Anniston, Alabama, 1981" in its entirety to read as follows:

**Sec. 15.58 – Stop intersections generally.**

When stop signs or signals are erected giving notice thereof, it shall be unlawful for any person driving or operating a vehicle to enter any of the first named streets in such list without first coming to a complete stop before entering such first named street:

Section C. All streets beginning with the letter "C" as follows:

- (1) Cambridge Place, at its intersection with Coleman Road, vehicles approaching from a westerly direction.
- (2) Canyon Drive, at its intersection or point of junction with Belmont Road.
- (3) Cave Road, at its intersection with Avenue B.
- (4) Centerbrook Drive, (N.W. corner) and Hillcrest Drive with Centerbrook being designated as the stop street with the sign facing west.
- (5) Chestnut Street, at its intersection with Quail Drive.
- (6) Chestnut Avenue, at its intersection with 3rd Street.
- (7) Christine Avenue, at its intersection with A Street.
- (8) Christine Avenue, at its intersection with E Street.
- (9) Christine Avenue, at its intersection with H Street.
- (10) Christine Avenue, at its intersection with J Street.
- (11) Choccolocco Road, at its intersection with Ronnaki Road.
- (12) Choccolocco Road, at its intersection with Terry Road.
- (13) Christine Avenue, at its intersection with A Street.
- (14) Christine Avenue, at its intersection with E Street.
- (15) Christine Avenue, at its intersection with H Street.
- (16) Christine Avenue, at its intersection with J Street.
- (17) Christine Avenue, at its intersection with L Street.
- (18) Christine Avenue, at the west side of its intersection with M Street.
- (19) Christine Avenue, at its intersection with 3rd Street.
- (20) Christine Avenue, at the northwest side of its intersection with 4th Street.

- (21)Reserved.

- (60)Crawford Avenue, at the east side of its intersection with 16th Street.
- (61)Crawford Avenue, and 16th Street, at the southeast, northeast, and southwest intersections, facing in southerly, easterly, and westerly directions.
- (62)Cresthill Drive, at its intersection with 31st Street facing north and south.
- (63)Crickett Lane, at its intersection with Hunter Place.
- (64)Crickett Lane, at its intersection with Patch Place.

Section 3. This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its adoption and publication one (1) time in The Anniston Star, a newspaper of general circulation published in the City of Anniston, Alabama, and the City Clerk is hereby ordered and directed to cause a copy of this Ordinance to be published one time in said newspaper.

**ORDINANCE NO. 18-O-6**  
**AN ORDINANCE DECLARING SURPLUS REAL PROPERTY**

WHEREAS, the City of Anniston, Alabama (the "City") does own and possess certain real property commonly known as the Anniston City Jail located within the Justin Sollohub Justice Center and specifically depicted as Sectors D and E in the attached Exhibit A (referred to herein as the "Property");

WHEREAS, the City, the Commission for Calhoun County, Alabama (the "Commission") and Mathew Wade, as Sheriff of Calhoun County, Alabama (the "Sheriff") have agreed to enter into a lease and inter-governmental services agreement whereby the County and the Sheriff lease the Property from the City for a term of two years, effective June 1, 2018; and, as consideration for the lease, the Sheriff shall assume responsibility for the operations of the jail and the incarceration of the City's inmates, among other good and valuable consideration;

WHEREAS, due to the agreement between the City, Commission and Sheriff, under which the City will cease use and operation of the Anniston City Jail, the Council finds that it is in the best interests of the City and its citizens to declare the Property surplus, in accordance with Ala. Code § 11-47-21, so that the City may lease the Property to the Commission and Sheriff;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Anniston, Alabama as follows:  
Section 1. Declaration of Surplus Real Property. It is hereby established and declared that the real property of the City of Anniston depicted in the attached Exhibit A as Sectors D and E of the Justin Sollohub Justice Center is no longer used or needed by the City of Anniston for public or municipal purposes and may be leased to the Commission and Sheriff pursuant to the terms and conditions of that certain lease and intergovernmental services agreement approved and executed by and between the City, Commission and Sheriff.

Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its adoption and publication as required by law.

WHEREAS, the City of Anniston, Alabama ("City"), the Commission for Calhoun County, Alabama ("Commission"), and Mathew Wade, as Sheriff of Calhoun County, Alabama ("Sheriff") desire to enter into a lease and inter-governmental services agreement whereby the County and the Sheriff will lease the Anniston City Jail from the City for a term of two years, effective June 1, 2018; and, as consideration for the lease, the Sheriff shall assume responsibility for the operations of the jail and the incarceration of the City's inmates, among other good and valuable consideration;

WHEREAS, the Council for the City of Anniston has passed and adopted an ordinance declaring the Anniston City Jail to be surplus property so that it may be leased to the Commission and Sheriff in accordance with the terms and conditions approved herein;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council for the City of Anniston, Alabama as follows:

Section 1. The Mayor and the City Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to execute and attest, respectively, for and on behalf of the City of Anniston, Alabama, the lease and inter-governmental services agreement by and between the City, Commission and Sheriff in substantially the form of the agreement attached hereto as Exhibit A.

Section 2. The Council finds and declares that the terms of the agreement approved and authorized by this resolution, including the Sheriff's agreement to take charge, custody and control of the City's inmate population and the County's agreement to keep and maintain the Anniston City Jail and its facilities, provide valuable and sufficient consideration for the lease conveyance and will serve a public purpose.
