The City Council of the City of Anniston, Alabama, met in Regular Session in the Council Chamber in the City Hall of the City of Anniston, Alabama, on Tuesday, January 8, 2019, at approximately 5:34 o'clock p.m.

Anthony Cook, Pastor of Christian Fellowship Bible Church, prayed the Invocation.

Anthony Cook, Pastor of Christian Fellowship Bible Church, led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Council Member Reddick left the council chambers at 5:35 p.m.

Council Member Reddick returned to the Council Chambers at 5:37 p.m.

Mayor Draper called the meeting to order. On call of the roll, the following Council Members were found to be present: Council Members Jenkins, Reddick, Little, Harris and Draper; absent: none. A quorum was present and the meeting opened for the transaction of business.

Jay Johnson, City Manager, was present.

Bruce Downey, City Attorney, was present.

Council Member Jenkins made a motion to waive the reading and approve the minutes from the December 18, 2018 meeting. The motion was seconded by Council Member Harris; and on call of the roll the following vote was recorded: ayes: Council Member Jenkins, Reddick, Harris, and Draper; nays: Council Member Little. The motion carried.

Mayor Draper made a motion to approve the agenda with the additions of motions (D) Authorizing a letter to Calhoun County Commission requesting extension of CRHS agreement for three (3) months, and (E) Honorary Street Naming. The motion was seconded by Council Member Harris; and on call of the roll the following vote was recorded: ayes: Council Member Jenkins, Reddick, Little, Harris, and Draper; nays: none. The motion carried.

Mr. Folks introduced and recognized Mrs. Hall and the Randolph Park students and their 1st Tee Program.

Council Member Little left the Council Chambers at 5:48 p.m.

Council Member Little returned to the Council Chambers at 5:49 p.m.

Ralph Bradford addressed the Council on matters of the Declaration of Independence and the Council Manger Act.

Glen Ray, 3514 Dale Hollow, addressed the council on 3 minute time limit and public record request information.

Roger Trammell addressed the council again regarding the nuisance house at 3004 Macklemore, which continues to be a problem, and law enforcement has not done anything about it.

Mimi Buscoffee, 3000 Crest hill Ave, thanked David Reddick and council for taking care of her problem.

Mayor Draper made a motion to approve the consent agenda:
