The City Council of the City of Anniston, Alabama, met in Regular Session in the Council Chamber in the City Hall of the City of Anniston, Alabama, on Tuesday, January 25, 2011, at approximately 4:40 o'clock p.m.

Council Member Palmore prayed the Invocation.

Council Member Palmore led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Mayor Robinson called the meeting to order. On call of the roll the following Council Members were found to be present: Council Members Spain, Palmore, Little, Dawson and Robinson; absent: none. A quorum was present and the meeting opened for the transaction of business.

Don A. Hoyt, City Manager, was present.

Cleo Thomas, City Attorney, was present.

Council Member Dawson made a motion to dispense with the reading of and approve the minutes of December 14, 2010. The motion was seconded by Council Member Palmore; and on call of the roll the following vote was recorded: ayes: Council Members Spain, Palmore, Little, Dawson and Robinson; nays: none. The motion carried.

Council Member Dawson made a motion to table a proposed ordinance establishing the creation of a City department to be known as the Department of Planning and Economic Development and a proposed motion to adopt a "Policy on the Use of Social Networking Sites by Anniston City Employees" and delete a resolution appointing a member to the Historic Preservation Commission and to adopt the agenda as so amended. The motion was seconded by Council Member Little; and on call of the roll the following vote was recorded: ayes: Council Members Spain, Palmore, Little, Dawson and Robinson; nays: none. The motion carried.

Mayor Robinson made a motion to remove from the table a motion to appropriate \$15,000.00 to the Spirit of Anniston for the Civil Rights Mural to be located on West 15th Street. The motion was seconded by Council Member Dawson; and on call of the roll the following vote was recorded: ayes: Council Members Spain, Palmore, Little, Dawson and Robinson; nays: none. The motion carried.

Mayor Robinson made a motion to amend his motion to appropriate \$15,000.00 to the Spirit of Anniston for the Civil Rights Mural to be located on West 15th Street to change the amount to \$7,500.00. The motion was seconded by Council Member Dawson.

Council Member Spain asked why they were reducing the amount.

Mayor Robinson stated that the County was willing to match the City's \$7,500.00.

Peggy Grubbs, chair of the Spirit of Anniston, stated they were trying to find matching funds to take care of \$7,500 of the \$15,000 if the City is willing to match the \$7,500. She stated they would need to get a commitment for \$7,500 from another source before requiring the City to provide their \$7,500.

Mayor Robinson withdrew his motion to amend his motion to appropriate \$15,000.00 to the Spirit of Anniston for the Civil Rights Mural to be located on West 15th Street to change the amount to \$7,500.00.

On call of the roll on Mayor Robinson's motion to appropriate \$15,000.00 to the Spirit of Anniston for the Civil Rights Mural to be located on West 15th Street and Council Member Dawson's second to said motion the following vote was recorded: ayes: Council Members Palmore and Dawson; nays: Council Members Spain, Little and Robinson. The motion failed.

Council Member Dawson introduced and read Ordinance Number 11-O-1 as follows:

ORDINANCE NUMBER 11-O-1

AN ORDINANCE ORDERING THE REMOVAL OF STOP SIGNS ON HILLYER HIGH AT ITS INTERSECTION WITH RUBY RIDGE

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Anniston, Alabama as follows:

Section 1. That the stop signs presently in place on the northeast and southwest side of Hillyer High at its intersection with Ruby Ridge be and the same are hereby ordered removed.

Section 2. Any ordinance declaring an offense for violation of the aforementioned stop signs are hereby expressly repealed.

Section 3. This ordinance shall go into effect upon its passage and adoption and publication as required by law.

Council Member Dawson made a motion for the unanimous consent of the Council for the immediate consideration of Ordinance Number 11-O-1 as introduced and read. The motion was seconded by Council Member Little; and on call of the roll the following vote was recorded: ayes: Council Members Spain, Palmore, Little, Dawson and Robinson; nays: none. The motion carried. Unanimous consent of the Council having been given for immediate consideration of Ordinance Number 11-O-1 as introduced and read, Council Member Dawson made a motion for the passage and adoption of Ordinance Number 11-O-1 as introduced and read. The motion was seconded by Council Member Little; and on call of the roll the following vote was recorded: ayes: Council Members Spain, Palmore, Little, Dawson, and Robinson; nays: none. The motion carried and Ordinance Number 11-O-1 was passed and adopted.

Council Member Dawson made a motion for the unanimous consent of the Council to introduce and read by title Ordinance Number 11-O-2. The motion was seconded by Council Member Little.

Mayor Robinson asked if anyone wished to address the Council either in favor of or in opposition to the introduction and reading by title of Ordinance Number 11-O-2.

No one addressed the Council either in favor of or in opposition to the introduction and reading by title of Ordinance Number 11-O-2.

On call of the roll on Council Member Dawson's motion for the unanimous consent of the Council to introduce and read by title Ordinance Number 11-O-2 and Council Member Little's second to said motion the following vote was recorded: ayes: Council Members Spain, Palmore, Little, Dawson and Robinson; nays: none. The motion carried.

Unanimous consent of the Council having been granted for the introduction and reading by title of Ordinance Number 11-O-2, Council Member Dawson introduced and read by title Ordinance Number 11-O-2 as follows:

ORDINANCE NO. 11-0-2

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTIONS 15.49 AND 15.51 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY PROHIBITING PARKING ON A PORTION OF OAK STREET AND ESTABLISHING A PORTION OF OAK STREET AS A ONE WAY STREET GOING WEST.

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Anniston, Alabama as follows:

Section 1. The City Council of the City of Anniston, Alabama hereby amends the following sections of "The Code of the City of Anniston, Alabama, 1981" as follows:

Section 2. That Section 15.49 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Anniston, Alabama is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 15.49. - One-way streets and alleys.

Upon those streets and alleys, or parts thereof, for one-way traffic, vehicular traffic shall move only in the indicated direction when signs indicating the location of traffic are erected and maintained at every intersection where movement in the opposite direction is prohibited.

The following streets and alleys, or parts thereof, are designated as one-way in the direction indicated:

- (a) *Atlanta Avenue*, from 10th Street to 11th Street, southbound traffic only.
- (b) *Andre Franklin Drive*, from Moses Street to the intersection of Andre Franklin Drive with the east right-of-way line of Zinn Parkway Drive, northbound traffic only.
- (c) *Cooper Avenue*, from the south line of 14th Street 120 feet south, northbound traffic only.
- (d) *Elizabeth Avenue*, from 10th Street, southbound traffic only between the hours of 7:00 a.m. to 7:45 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. to 2:45 p.m. on Mondays through Fridays when school is in session; at all other times, such portion of Elizabeth Avenue shall remain a two-way street.
- (e) *King Street*, from the north/south alley between Mulberry Avenue and Cooper Avenue to the west line of Mulberry Avenue, eastbound traffic only.
- (f) *McCoy Avenue*, from 24th Street to 27th Street, northbound traffic only.
- (g) *Rockridge Drive*, from Leighton Avenue to 25th Street, eastbound traffic only.
- (h) *Walnut Avenue*, from 25th Street to 27th Street, southbound traffic only.
- (i) *Zinn Parkway Drive*, from its intersection with Andre Franklin Drive to Moses Street, southbound traffic only.
- (j) *Alley between Noble Street on the west, and Wilmer Avenue on the east*, from a point at its intersection with 8th Street to a point 200 feet south of its intersection with 9th Street, northbound traffic only.

- (k) *Alley between Noble Street on the west and Wilmer Avenue on the east and between 10th Street on the south and 13th Street on the north, southbound traffic only.*
- (l) *Alley between Park Avenue to 7th Street, the directional traffic on such alley shall proceed from the place where the alley intersects with Park Avenue and curve with the alley to the place where the alley intersects at 7th Street.*
- (m) *Alley between Quintard Avenue and Leighton Avenue, from 10th Street to 11th Street, northbound traffic only.*
- (n) *Alley between 10th Street and 11th Street, and Fairmont Avenue and Woodstock Avenue, westbound traffic only.*
- (o) *First alley east of Gurnee Avenue, from 11th Street south to 10th Street, southbound traffic only.*
- (p) *East/west alley between "A" Street and "B" Street, with flow of traffic in an easterly direction Monday through Saturday of each week. On Sunday, such alley shall be open for two-way traffic traveling east and west.*
- (r) *First east/west alley north of "B" Street between South Christine Avenue and South Allen Avenue, eastbound traffic only.*
- (s) *First north/south alley west of Keith Avenue, between 9th Street and 10th Street, northbound traffic only.*
- (t) *North/south alley, between Mulberry Avenue and Cooper Avenue, from 14th Street to 12th Street, southbound traffic only.*
- (u) *First alley east of Noble Street, from 13th Street south to 9th Street, southbound traffic only.*
- (v) *First alley west of Noble Street, from a point 150 feet north of 9th Street to 13th Street, northbound traffic only.*
- (w) *First alley east of Quintard Avenue, from 17th Street to 18th Street, northbound traffic only.*
- (x) *First alley east of Wilmer Avenue, from 14th Street south to 12th Street, southbound traffic only, from 10th Street south to 9th Street, southbound traffic only.*
- (y) *First alley north of 7th Street, between Lapsley Avenue and Keith Avenue, westbound traffic only.*

(z) *First alley north of 10th Street, between Gurnee Avenue and Moore Avenue, westbound traffic only.*

(aa) Oak Street from Highland Avenue to Keith (north segment), west bound traffic only.

Section 3. That Section 15.51 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Anniston, Alabama is hereby amended to read:

Sec. 15.51. - Prohibited parking zones.

When signs are erected giving notice thereof, no person shall at any time park a vehicle upon any of the streets, or portions thereof, designated as no parking zones. The following streets, or portions thereof, are hereby designated as no parking zones:

- (1) *Andre Franklin Drive*, south side of Andre Franklin Drive from its intersection with Zinn Parkway Drive eastward to the curve, in the City of Anniston, Alabama, and on the south side of Moses Street from the intersection of Zinn Parkway Drive eastward to Brockman Street.
- (2) *Allen Avenue*, north of the northwest stop sign on E Street and along the curblines south of the southeast stop sign on E Street to a point where each of such curblines intersects with the first driveway north and south, respectively.
- (3) *Argyle Place*, on the north side, between Knox Avenue on the east and the first north/south alley lying west of Knox Avenue on the west.
- (4) *B Street*, on the north side from the east right-of-way line of Wilmer Avenue east to the west right-of-way line of Quintard Avenue.
- (5) *B Street*, on the south side from a point 90 feet east of the east right-of-way line of Wilmer Avenue east a distance of 30 feet.
- (6) *Bancroft Avenue*, on the east and west side from the south right-of-way line of the 19th Street North 250 feet to the north line of the entrance drive to Randolph Park.
- (7) *Blue Mountain Road*, between Quintard Avenue and Noble Street.
- (8) *Blue Ridge Drive*, on the southwesterly side, between a place thereon 107.84 feet northwesterly from where the southwesterly curblines of Blue Ridge Drive intersects with the northwesterly right-of-way line of Sidney Circle and a place on Blue Ridge Drive 197.84 feet northwesterly from where the southwesterly curblines of Blue

Ridge Drive intersects with the northwesterly right-of-way line of Sidney Circle.

- (9) *Chestnut Avenue*, on the east side, between 2nd Street and 3rd Street.
- (10) *Chestnut Avenue*, on the west side, from 2nd Street to 3rd Street.
- (11) *Choccolocco Road*, on the south side, from the east right-of-way line of Robertson Road east a distance of 495 feet.
- (12) *Christine Avenue*, on the east side, beginning at the intersection of 11th Street and Christine Avenue and proceeding 60 feet south.
- (13) *Christine Avenue*, on the west side, from 10th Street, north a distance of 25 feet.
- (14) *Christine Drive*, on the east or north side, as the case may be, from 17th Street to Christine Avenue.
- (15) *Christine Drive*, on the west side from the point of junction of its west boundary line with an alley to a point on the west side of Christine Drive a distance of 10 feet north of said point of junction.
- (16) *Christine Drive*, on the south side from the point of junction of its south boundary line with an alley to a point on the south side of Christine Drive a distance of 10 feet east of said point of junction.
- (17) *Cobb Avenue*, on the west side, from 13th Street to 15th Street.
- (18) *Cooper Avenue*, on the west side, from 15th Street to 19th Street.
- (19) *Crescent Avenue*, on the north side, from the point where Crescent Avenue intersects or meets with Highland Avenue and intersects or meets with Champaign Avenue, between 8:00 a.m. and 3:30 p.m., Monday through Friday.
- (20) *Dooley Avenue*, on the east side, from 18th Street to 20th Street.
- (21) *E Street*, on the south side, between Noble and Wilmer Avenue.
- (22) *Elizabeth Street*, on the east and west side from the north right-of-way line of Tenth Street to a point 200 feet north of the north right-of-way line of Eleventh Street.
- (23) *Front Street*, between a point 57 feet north of the north right-of-way line of Randolph Street, if extended, and a point 366 feet north of said first point, said distance being measured upon the surface of said Front Street.

- (24) *Glenaddie Avenue*, on the east side, from 6th Street to 10th Street.
- (25) *Glenaddie Avenue*, on the west side, from 4th Street to 6th Street.
- (26) *Glenaddie Avenue*, on the west side, between 14th Street and 15th Street.
- (27) *Gurnee Avenue*, on the east side, from a point 300 feet south of 10th Street, south to Alabama Highway 202.
- (28) *Gurnee Avenue*, on the east side, from 11th Street, north a distance of 20 feet.
- (29) *Gurnee Avenue*, on the east side, from a point 60 feet north of 13th Street, north to 15th Street.
- (30) *Gurnee Avenue*, on the east side, between 17th Street and 18th Street and from 18th Street, north a distance of 120 feet.
- (31) *Gurnee Avenue*, on both sides, from 21st Street to 22nd Street.
- (32) *Highland Avenue*, on the east side, from 10th Street to 11th Street.
- (33) *Highland Avenue*, on the west side, from 9th Street to 15th Street.
- (34) *Highland Avenue*, on the east side, between 11th Street and Crescent Avenue, from 8:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., Monday through Friday.
- (35) *Hospital Drive*, between the junction of the said Hospital Drive with 8th Street and a point 215 feet north of 8th Street at the junction of the said Hospital Drive with the real property line of the regional medical center board.
- (36) *Jefferson Avenue*, on the west side, from 7th Street, north to 10th Street.
- (37) *Jefferson Avenue*, on the east side, from a point beginning on Forest Lane and running north along the east side of Jefferson Avenue a distance of 230 feet.
- (38) *Johnston Drive*, on the north side, from Bacon Avenue, north to 18th Street.
- (39) *Johnston Drive*, on the south side, between Abbott Avenue and Bacon Avenue.
- (40) *LeGarde Avenue*, east and west sides, from the south right-of-way line of 10th Street south to the north right-of-way line of State Highway 202 (8th Street).

- (41) *LeGrande Avenue*, on the west side, from 19th Street to 20th Street.
- (42) *Leighton Avenue*, on the east side, between B Street and C Street.
- (43) *Leighton Avenue*, on the west side, from a point beginning at the southwest corner of Leighton Avenue and E Street to a point 92 feet south of such corner.
- (44) *Leighton Avenue*, on the west side, from a point commencing at the northwest corner of Leighton Avenue and E Street and running north along the west side of Leighton Avenue a distance of 40 feet.
- (45) *Leighton Avenue*, on the east and west sides, from the intersection of Leighton Avenue and 8th Street, south to the entrance of Johnston Elementary School.
- (46) *Leighton Avenue*, on the east side, from G Street to 22nd Street.
- (47) *Leighton Avenue*, on both sides, between 6th Street and 17th Street.
- (48) *Leighton Avenue*, on the west side, from 18th Street, south a distance of 57 feet.
- (49) *Leighton Avenue*, on the west side, from 18th Street, north a distance of 57 feet.
- (50) *Leighton Avenue*, on the west side, from 20th Street, north a distance of 50 feet.
- (51) *Leighton Avenue*, on the west side, from 20th Street, south a distance of 42 feet.
- (52) *McCoy Avenue*, on the west side, from 19th Street to 20th Street.
- (53) *McCoy Avenue*, on the west side, from 21st Street, south for one-half block.
- (54) *McCoy Avenue*, on the east side, from 24th Street to 26th Street.
- (55) *Moore Avenue*, on the east side, from the first alley north of 10th Street, south a distance of 64 feet.
- (56) *Moore Avenue*, on the west side, from 11th Street, south a distance of 50 feet.
- (57) *Moore Avenue*, on the east side, from 11th Street, south a distance of 123 feet.

- (58) *Moore Avenue*, on the west side, from 12th Street, south a distance of 143 feet.
- (59) *Moore Avenue*, on the east side, from 11th Street to 12th Street.
- (60) *Moore Avenue*, on both sides, from 12th Street to 15th Street.
- (61) *Moore Avenue*, on the east side, from 15th Street to 18th Street.
- (62) *Moore Avenue*, on the west side, from 18th Street to 19th Street.
- (63) *Moore Avenue*, on the north, northerly or east side from its junction with McKelroy Avenue to its junction with 26th Street.
- (64) *Moore Avenue*, on the west side between 24th Street and 25th Street.
- (65) *Mulberry Avenue*, on the west side, from 4th Street, north a distance of 35 feet.
- (66) *Mulberry Avenue*, on the west side, from 6th Street, north a distance of 92 feet.
- (67) *Mulberry Avenue*, on the west side, from 9th Street to 10th Street.
- (68) *Mulberry Avenue*, on both sides, from 13th Street to 14th Street.
- (69) *Noble Street*, on the west side, from 10th Street, south a distance of 69 feet.
- (70) *Noble Street*, on the east side, from 10th Street, north a distance of 74 feet.
- (71) *Noble Street*, on both sides, between 22nd Street and Blue Mountain Road.
- (72) *Palmetto Avenue*, on the east side, from 3rd Street to 6th Street.
- (73) *Park Avenue*, on the east side, from 7th Street, north a distance of 170 feet.
- (74) *Pelham Heights Road*, also known as First Street, on the north or northeasterly side, between State Highway No. 21 and the traffic circle at the northwesterly end of Pelham Heights Road or at any place on such traffic circle, at any time between the hours of 7:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. on Monday through Friday of each week.
- (75) *Pine Avenue*, on the east side, from 11th Street to 13th Street.

- (76) **Pine Avenue*, on the east side from a point at its intersection with West 12½ Street, north to West 13th Street.
- (77) **Pine Avenue*, from its intersection on the south with West 13th Street, north 98 feet more or less to its intersection with a 20-foot east/west alley.
- (78) **Pine Avenue*, on the west side, from its intersection with 12th Street, north to its intersection with 13th Street.
- (79) **Pine Avenue*, on the east and west side from its intersection with 14th Street south, on the west side to its intersection with 13th Street, and on its east side to the intersection with a 20-foot east/west alley between West 13th Street and 14th Street. Parking prohibited between 10:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m.
- (80) **Pine Avenue*, on the east side from its intersection with West 12½ Street south to its intersection with West 11th Street. Parking prohibited between 10:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m.
- (81) **Pine Avenue*, on the west side from a point at its intersection with 12th Street on the north, south to its intersection with West 11th Street. Parking prohibited between 10:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m.
- (82) *Quintard Avenue*, on both sides, from Greenbrier Drive to 22nd Street.
- (83) *Robertson Road*, on the west side, between Choccolocco Road and Lad Drive.
- (84) *Rockridge Drive*, on the north side, from Leighton Avenue to 25th Street.
- (85) *Rocky Hollow Road*, on the northwesterly side, between 16th Street and 20th Street.
- (86) *South Allen Street*, on the west side, from C Street to D Street, adjacent to the South Allen recreational facilities, at any time.
- (87) *South Quintard Avenue*, on both sides, between Greenbrier Road and P Street.
- (88) *South Side of 25th Street* from Quintard Avenue to Brighton Avenue.
- (89) *Stephens Avenue*, on the east side, from 15th Street, south a distance of 30 feet.

- (90) *Stephens Avenue*, on the west side, from 15th Street, south a distance of 30 feet.
- (91) *Thomas Avenue*, on the south side, beginning at the southeast intersection of Johnston Drive and Thomas Avenue and proceeding 334 feet down the south side of Thomas Avenue to a point, such point being the point of beginning; thence a distance of 57 feet to a point along the south side of Thomas Avenue.
- (92) *Walnut Avenue*, on the west side, from the north boundary line of that property known as 2506 Walnut Avenue to the north boundary line of that property known as 2406 Walnut Avenue.
- (93) *Walnut Avenue*, on the east side, from 21st Street to 22nd Street.
- (94) *Walnut Avenue*, on the west side, from 22nd Street, north a distance of 29 feet.
- (95) *Walnut Avenue*, on the east side, from 27th Street, south to 2417 Walnut Avenue.
- (96) *Walnut Avenue*, on the [east] side, from 27th Street to 26th Street.
- (97) *Walnut Avenue*, on the west side, from 28th Street to 29th Street.
- (98) *Walnut Avenue*, on the west side, from 29th Street, north a distance of 395 feet.
- (99) *Williams Avenue*, on the west side, from a point 50 feet south of its intersection of 12th Street for a distance of 80 feet.
- (100) *Wilmer Avenue*, on both the east and west curb lines, from "C" Street north to 6th Street, less and except the following:

- From a point 5 feet south of the north right-of way line of A Street, north 52 feet.
- From a point 25 feet south of the south right-of-way line of 6th Street, south 60 feet.

- (110) *C Street*, on the north side, from Quintard Avenue east to the alley.
- (111) *C Street*, on both sides, between Quintard and Wilmer Avenues at any time.
- (112) *D Street*, on the north side, between the west boundary line of the first north/south alley lying east of Wilmer Avenue and a point 105 feet west of such west boundary line of the alley, except temporarily for the purpose of and while actually engaged in loading or unloading school children.
- (113) *D Street*, on the north side, from a point 150 feet west of the intersection of D Street and Quintard Avenue, east to a point 150 feet from such intersection.
- (114) *D Street*, on the south side, from a point 150 feet west of the intersection of D Street and Quintard Avenue, east to such intersection.
- (115) *D Street*, on the north side, from Quintard Avenue west to the alley.

- (116) *F Street*, on the north side, from the intersection of F Street and Noble Street, east to the first alley intersecting F Street east of Noble Street.
- (117) *F Street*, on the south side, between Noble Street and Quintard Avenue, except on Sundays.
- (118) *I Street*, also known as Greenbrier Drive, on both sides, between Quintard Avenue and Noble Street.

(c) The Council has been presented with and considered a financing plan whereby (i) the Authority would issue its Building Revenue Bonds (DHR Project), Series 2011 (the "Series 2011 Bonds") in the aggregate principal amount of approximately \$16,000,000; (ii) the Series 2011 Bonds will be issued under an Indenture of Trust between the Authority and Regions Bank, as Trustee; (iii) under a Statutory Warranty Deed from the City to the Authority (the "Statutory Warranty Deed"), the City will convey the site of the Project, as more particularly described in the form of Statutory Warranty Deed attached hereto as Exhibit A, with such minor changes to such description as shall be necessary to describe such property accurately (the "Project Site"), to the Authority; (iv) the Authority will lease the Project to the City pursuant to a Lease Agreement (the "Lease Agreement"); and (v) contemporaneously with the execution and delivery of the Lease Agreement, the City will enter into a Sublease Agreement (the "Sublease Agreement") with the State of Alabama, acting by and through its Department of Human Resources (the "Department").

(d) It is necessary, advisable and in the public interest that the City convey the Project site to the Authority and enter into the Lease and Sublease.

Section 2. Authorization of Statutory Warranty Deed. The conveyance of the Project Site to the Authority and the execution and delivery of the Statutory Warranty Deed be, and the same are, hereby authorized and approved. The Mayor of the City is hereby authorized to execute and deliver the Statutory Warranty Deed, and the Statutory Warranty Deed shall be in substantially the form attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and by this reference incorporated herein and made a part hereof, subject to such changes, insertions and omissions, including, without limitation, minor corrective changes to the description of the Project Site, or a description of the Project Site by reference to a recorded subdivision plat, all as may be approved by the Mayor of the City, and the execution of the Statutory Warranty Deed by the Mayor of the City as herein authorized shall be conclusive evidence of any such approval.

Section 3. Authorization of Lease Agreement. The execution and delivery of the Lease Agreement by and between the City and the Authority (the "Lease Agreement") be, and the same is, hereby authorized and approved. The Mayor of the City is hereby authorized to execute and deliver the Lease Agreement, and the City Clerk of the City is hereby authorized to attest the same and affix the seal of the City thereto,

and the Lease Agreement shall be in substantially the form attached hereto as Exhibit "B" and by this reference incorporated herein and made a part hereof, subject to such changes, insertions and omissions as may be approved by the Mayor of the City, and the execution of the Lease Agreement by the Mayor of the City and the City Clerk of the City as herein authorized shall be conclusive evidence of any such approval.

Section 4. Authorization of Sublease Agreement. The execution and delivery of the Sublease Agreement by and between the City and the State of Alabama, acting by and through its Department of Human Resources (the "Sublease Agreement") be, and the same is, hereby authorized and approved. The Mayor of the City is hereby authorized to execute and deliver the Sublease Agreement, and the City Clerk of the City is hereby authorized to attest the same and affix the seal of the City thereto, and the Lease Agreement shall be in substantially the form attached hereto as Exhibit "C" and by this reference incorporated herein and made a part hereof, subject to such changes, insertions and omissions as may be approved by the Mayor of the City, and the execution of the Sublease Agreement by the Mayor of the City and the City Clerk of the City as herein authorized shall be conclusive evidence of any such approval.

Section 5. Authorization. The Mayor of the City and the City Clerk of the City are each hereby authorized, directed and empowered to execute and deliver any and all documents, instruments or writing authorized hereby or necessary or convenient in connection with the consummation of the transactions contemplated by issuance of the Authority of its Building Revenue Bonds (DHR Project), Series 2011 in the aggregate principal amount of up to \$16,000,000.
