The City Council of the City of Anniston, Alabama, met in Regular Session in the Council Chamber in the City Hall of the City of Anniston, Alabama, on Monday, January 27, 2014, at approximately 5:34 o'clock p.m.

Council Member Robert Avery, Gadsden, prayed the Invocation.

Council Member Robert Avery, Gadsden, led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Mayor Stewart called the meeting to order. On call of the roll the following Council Members were found to be present: Council Members Jenkins, Reddick, Selase, Harris and Stewart; absent: none. A quorum was present and the meeting opened for the transaction of business.

Brian Johnson, City Manager, was present.

Bruce Downey, City Attorney, was present.

Council Member Selase made a motion to waive the reading of the minutes of January 13, 2014. The motion was seconded by Council Member Jenkins; and on call of the roll the following vote was recorded: ayes: Council Members Jenkins, Reddick, Selase, Harris and Stewart; nays: none. The motion carried.

Council Member Jenkins made a motion to approve the minutes of January 13, 2014. The motion was seconded by Council Member Reddick; and on call of the roll the following vote was recorded: ayes: Council Members Jenkins, Reddick, Selase, Harris and Stewart; nays: none. The motion carried.

Council Member Jenkins made a motion to add a public comment period concerning the prohibition of portable coolers prior to the reintroduction of the ordinance prohibiting the use of portable coolers for the off-premises sale of alcoholic beverages and to adopt the agenda as amended. The motion was seconded by Council Member Harris; and on call of the roll the following vote was recorded: ayes: Council Members Jenkins, Reddick, Selase, Harris and Stewart; nays: none. The motion carried.

Council Member Selase made a motion to approve the Consent Agenda items (a) a resolution authorizing reimbursements to City officials for expenses incurred while traveling away from the city (b) a motion to approve the request to block certain Anniston streets as shown on the attached map for the YMCA Spring 5K Run on Saturday, April 5, 2014 and (c) a motion to approve the wrecker rotation service applications for the year 2014. The motion was seconded by Council Member Reddick; and on call of the roll the following vote was recorded: ayes: Council Members Jenkins, Reddick, Selase, Harris and Stewart; nays: none. The motion carried.

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Council Member Selase made a motion for the unanimous consent of the Council to introduce and read by title Ordinance Number 14-O-2. The motion was seconded by Council Member Jenkins.

Mayor Stewart asked if anyone wished to address the Council either in favor of or in opposition to the introduction and reading by title of Ordinance Number 14-O-2.

No one addressed the Council either in favor of or in opposition to the introduction and reading by title of Ordinance Number 14-O-2.

On call of the roll on Council Member Selase's motion for the unanimous consent of the Council to introduce and read by title Ordinance Number 14-O-2 and Council Member Jenkins' second to said motion the following vote was recorded: ayes: Council Members Jenkins, Reddick, Selase, Harris and Stewart; nays: none. The motion carried.

Unanimous consent of the Council having been granted to introduce and read by title Ordinance Number 14-O-2, Council Member Selase introduced and read by title Ordinance Number 14-O-2 as follows:

The motion carried.

Unanimous consent of the Council having been granted to introduce and read by title Resolution Number 14-R-116, Council Member Selase introduced and read by title Resolution Number 14-R-116 as follows:

(14-R-116, declaring a reported condition to be a public nuisance)

Council Member Jenkins made a motion for the passage and adoption of Resolution Number 14-R-116 as introduced and read by title. The motion was seconded by Council Member Reddick; and on call of the roll the following vote was recorded: ayes: Council Members Jenkins, Reddick, Selase, Harris and Stewart; nays: none. The motion carried and Resolution Number 14-R-116 was passed and adopted.

Alan Atkinson, City Clerk, advised that copies of the following Bid Fact Sheet had been given to the Council:

Council Member Reddick made a motion that the bids in the total amounts of \$18.00/ea for work jeans, \$6.70/ea for tee shirts and \$56.00/ea for jackets by Tangibles and \$52.73/ea for coveralls by Brown and Bigelow be accepted. The motion was seconded by Council Member Selase; and on call of the roll the following vote was recorded: ayes: Council Members Jenkins, Reddick, Selase, Harris and Stewart; nays: none. The motion carried.

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Council Member Jenkins stated that David Dawson, former Council Member and Planning Commission Chairman, had passed away this past weekend. He stated Mr. Dawson was a good man who cared about this city.

Council Member Reddick stated that Mr. Dawson left behind an impressive legacy. He stated the City workers were doing a good job with the streets and nuisances. He commended the Police Department. He commended the Parks and Recreation Department for their warming stations.

He congratulated the Anniston High School Boys and Girls Basketball Teams for the winning the County Tournament. He asked for a work session on nuisance lots before the warm weather comes.
