The City Council of the City of Anniston, Alabama, met in Regular Session in the Council Chamber in the City Hall of the City of Anniston, Alabama, on Monday, March 24, 2014, at approximately 5:34 o'clock p.m.

Curtis Ray prayed the Invocation.

Curtis Ray led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Mayor Stewart called the meeting to order. On call of the roll the following Council Members were found to be present: Council Members Jenkins, Reddick, Selase, Harris and Stewart; absent: none. A quorum was present and the meeting opened for the transaction of business.

Brian Johnson, City Manager, was present.

Council Member Reddick made a motion to waive the reading of the minutes of February 24, 2014. The motion was seconded by Council Member Selase; and on call of the roll the following vote was recorded: ayes: Council Members Jenkins, Reddick, Selase, Harris and Stewart; nays: none. The motion carried.

Council Member Jenkins made a motion to approve the minutes of February 24, 2014. The motion was seconded by Council Member Harris; and on call of the roll the following vote was recorded: ayes: Council Members Jenkins, Reddick, Selase, Harris and Stewart; nays: none. The motion carried.

Anna Washington, Anniston Museum Complex Board, addressed the Council and stated the proposed ordinance was the wish of the Board. She stated this would help them know their responsibilities and the City’s responsibilities. She stated this was the unanimous wish of the Board.

Mayor Stewart stated that the Museum Board members present and Museum employees present could discuss the proposed ordinance further in the old Council Chambers and the Council would postpone the final vote until the end of the Council Meeting.

Council Member Jenkins introduced and read Resolution Number 14-R-132 as follows:

Council Member Reddick stated that the Anniston Housing Authority needed approximately \$70,000 to renovate a duplex and they needed to include that money in the CDBG amendment.

Brian Johnson, City Manager, stated that money was not set aside in this proposed CDBG amendment.

Council Member Reddick asked if the money to renovate the duplex could be included in the 2013 funds.

Mr. Johnson stated that Council Member Reddick was referring to the request for the renovation by the Housing Authority that had been originally \$30,000 and was now over \$60,000. He stated the duplex was appraised at approximately \$26,000.

Council Member Reddick stated they were setting aside \$50,000 for an entrepreneurial center that they had not seen plans for. He stated they had seen the plans for the Anniston Housing Authority duplex renovation.

Mayor Stewart stated this was monies coming out of the 2011 and 2012 budget years but the 2013 budget year was still open.

Council Member Jenkins stated it would be hard to justify spending over \$60,000 to renovate a duplex appraised at \$26,000.

Jim Fenstermaker, CDBG consultant, stated that at this point all they had with the business incubator was a conversation and a request for them to submit a proposal. He stated there would have to be an amendment to the 2013 budget for that proposal to go forward.

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Mr. Johnson stated the business incubator was not in the 2011 and 2012 budget amendment.

On call of the roll on Council Member Selase's motion for the passage and adoption of Resolution Number 14-R-134 as introduced and read and Council Member Harris' second to said motion the following vote was recorded: ayes: Council Members Jenkins, Reddick, Selase, Harris and Stewart; nays: none. The motion carried.

Council Member Jenkins thanked the City and First Methodist Church in Anniston for a successful Southeastern International Mountain Bike Association summit which was held last Friday, Saturday and Sunday.

Council Member Reddick thanked the City Department Directors for all their hard work and for making the Council's job easier.

Council Member Selase invited the public to a meeting between the City, the Board of Education and the Housing Authority on April 1 at 6pm at the City Meeting Center. He thanked Don Hopper and International Automotive Components Group North America, Inc. for bringing new jobs into the city.

Council Member Harris stated the Canyon Run would be this Saturday morning.

Mayor Stewart stated that it was important that they had passed the beginning of building the West Anniston Wellness Park that night.

The motion carried and Ordinance Number 14-O-10 was passed and adopted.

There being no further business to come before the meeting at that time Council Member Selase made a motion the meeting be adjourned. The motion was seconded by Council Member Harris;

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and on call of the roll the following vote was recorded: ayes: Council Members Jenkins, Reddick, Selase, Harris and Stewart; nays: none. The motion carried and the meeting was adjourned at approximately 6:51 o'clock p.m.
