ORDINANCE NO. 18-O-10

AMENDING CHAPTER 4, ARTICLE I, SECTION 4.10(8) REGARDING CRUELTY TO ANIMALS

WHEREAS, the Council for the City of Anniston finds that the municipal law prohibiting the abandonment of animals, as stated in Chapter 4, Article I, Section 4.10(8) of "The Code of the City of Anniston, Alabama, 1981", is due to be amended to remove the twenty-four hour abandonment period for animals abandoned on the public streets, roads, alleys or public property;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council for the City of Anniston, Alabama as follows:

Section 1. The Council hereby amends and restates Chapter 4, Article I,

Section 4.10(8) in its entirety to read as follows:

Sec. 4.10 – Cruelty to Animals

It shall be unlawful for any person:

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* * *

(8) To abandon any animal on (a) any public street, road, alley or public property, or (b) any untenanted residence for more than twenty-four hours;

* * * *

Section 2. This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its adoption and publication one (1) time in The Anniston Star, a newspaper of general circulation published in the City of Anniston, Alabama, and the City Clerk is hereby ordered and directed to cause a copy of this ordinance to be published one (1) time in said newspaper.
