The City Council of the City of Anniston, Alabama, met in Regular Session in the Council Chamber in the City Hall of the City of Anniston, Alabama, on Tuesday, December 4, 2018, at approximately 5:35 o'clock p.m.

David Reddick, Council Member, prayed the Invocation.

David Reddick, Council Member, led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Mayor Draper called the meeting to order. On call of the roll, the following Council Members were found to be present: Council Members Jenkins, Reddick, Little, Harris and Draper; absent: none. A quorum was present and the meeting opened for the transaction of business.

Jay Johnson, City Manager, was present.

Bruce Downey, City Attorney, was present.

Mayor Draper made a motion to approve the agenda as amended with the addition of item D, a motion to waive the fee for the City Meeting Center for Reverend Rimpsey's Annual Christmas dinner. The motion was seconded by Council Member Jenkins; and on call of the roll, the following vote was recorded: ayes: Council Members Jenkins, Reddick, Little, Harris and Draper; nays: none. The motion carried.

Joanne Pope, 31 Dianna Hills Road, stated how happy the community is to have the caliber of the city manager to help move the city forward.

Jim Montgomery, P.O. Box 1870, stated that he has noticed disrespect of looking down when certain councilmembers speak from the city manager and city attorney. In addition, he addressed the temporary location of city hall.

Carol Malay, 2105 Woodland Ave, stated the council should do everything they can to make sure the federal courthouse comes to the City of Anniston.

Jane Cunningham, 67 Thornwood Oxford Al, stated that respect should be given to the city manager and that he continue to move Anniston forward.

Council Member Harris made a motion to approve the consent agenda:

- (a) Resolution authorizing reimbursements to city officials for expenses incurred while traveling away from the City (18-R-189)
- (b) Resolution authorizing a grant application to the Institute of Museum and Library Services (18-R-190)
- (c) Motion to authorize the Mayor to execute the agreement with Calhoun County Commission for resurfacing and replacing noted drainage structures on Buckelew Bridge Road at the City's share of 18.5% of project cost
- (d) Motion to waive the fee for the City Meeting Center for Reverend Rimpsey's Annual Christmas Dinner

The motion was seconded by Council Member Jenkins; and on call of the roll, the following vote was recorded: ayes: Council Members Jenkins, Reddick, Little, Harris and Draper; nays: none. The motion carried.

Jay Johnson, City Manager, introduced and read Resolution 18-R-191, A Resolution changing the curbside garbage collection service charge for each residential unit in the City of Anniston,

**RESOLUTION NO.18-R-191**

**A RESOLUTION CHANGING THE CURBSIDE GARBAGE COLLECTION SERVICE CHARGE FOR EACH RESIDENTIAL UNIT IN THE CITY OF ANNISTON**

WHEREAS, Section 12.52 (a) of the City Code of the City of Anniston, Alabama, as amended allows the City Council to change, alter or amend the curbside collection charge for each residential unit in the city; and

WHEREAS, the existing fee has not been changed or amended since January 1, 2011; and

WHEREAS, a review of solid waste fee revenue and expenses find an increase to be necessary;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Anniston, Alabama as follows:

Section 1. The curbside garbage collection service charge for each residential unit in the city of Anniston is changed to the sum of \$12.00 per month.

Section 2. That this Resolution shall become effective on January 1, 2019 provided however, that said Resolution shall have been published one time in The Anniston Star prior to said effective date.

Mayor Draper made a motion for passage and adoption of Resolution 18-R-191, A Resolution changing the curbside garbage collection service charge for each residential unit in the City of Anniston. The motion was seconded by Council Member Jenkins; and on call of the roll, the following vote was recorded: ayes: Council Members Jenkins, Reddick, Little, Harris and Draper; nays: none. The motion carried and Resolution 18-R-191 was passed and adopted.

Mayor Draper made a motion to appoint Pursuant to the Certificate of Reincorporation of The Health Care Authority of the City of Anniston, the board of directors has submitted in writing its Second Slate of candidate for appointment to the Place No. 8 director's term that expired on May 31, 2018, which includes Marcus Dunn, Robert Houston, Seyram Selase (Mr. Selase has withdrawn his name for consideration). The motion was seconded by Council Member Harris; and on call of the roll, the following

vote was recorded: ayes: Council Members Jenkins, Harris and Draper; abstentions: Council Member Reddick; nays: Council Member Little. The motion carried.

Mayor Draper made a motion for the temporary relocation of City Hall to the Anniston Star Building pursuant to the minimum terms of \$275,000.00 per year with utilities and furniture included. The motion was seconded by Council Member Jenkins; and on call of the roll, the following vote was recorded: ayes: Council Members Jenkins, Reddick, Harris and Draper; nays: Council Member Little. The motion carried.

Council Jenkins had no comment.

Council Member Reddick stated his reasoning for not voting for the hospital board appointment because he feels it is unconstitutional to take wards away from the council. He stated that he loves the citizens of Anniston and there is nothing they can do about it.

Council Member Little stated that he will email to the council a list of 11 items that will address the city manager and correction in certain areas and he wants them on the next work session agenda. He prays that God continues to give him the courage to look out for the people he represents and speak for them.

Council Member Harris wanted to thank everyone for coming out and support the most wonderful thing that is going to happen in Anniston. Thanks everyone for their comments in support of the City manager and she feels he is doing an outstanding job.

Mayor Draper had no comment.

There being no further business to come before the meeting at that time Mayor Draper made a motion the meeting be adjourned. The motion was seconded by Council Member Jenkins; and on call of the roll, the following vote was recorded: ayes: Council Members Jenkins, Reddick, Little, Harris, and Draper nays: none. The motion carried and the meeting was adjourned at approximately 6:31 o'clock p.m.
