





April, the fourth month on our calendars, lasts for 30 days. Its name comes from Latin, but we're not entirely sure what it means. Some think it might have something to do with things starting to open up or getting sunny, as it's when spring begins and plants start growing. Another idea is that it's linked to Aphrodite, the Greek goddess of love and beauty, who was called Apru by the Etruscans. This connection is seen in old Roman customs, where April was a time to celebrate Aphrodite

Prior to the addition of January and February at the end of the year by King Numa Pompilius around 700 BCE, April was originally the second month in the Roman calendar year. In 450 BCE, April was shifted to the fourth position with 29 days. With the introduction of the Gregorian calendar by Pope Gregory XIII in 1582, an extra day was added, making April a 30-day month.

April often brings unpredictable weather. In response to this, traditional weather beliefs offer insight into dealing with the spring's unpredictability. In the past, people relied on animal behavior as a weather indicator. For instance, there's an old saying: "the louder the frogs, the more rain to come." This stems from the frogs' ability to sense rising humidity, leading them to croak louder. However, this behavior serves their mating purposes rather than forecasting weather. Male frogs increase their croaking before rainstorms because they reproduce more successfully after rainfall, laying their eggs in freshwater bodies.


